

U **Out to Ser** Time Takes C. me -----

Third-year law student, Frank Williams, had to put his legal education on hold for several months due to an unexpected "Storm." Marine Captain Frank Williams was sent to Saudi Arabia December 21,1990 as an intelligence officer in the 8th Tank Battalion.

Frank joined the Marines in the early 1980's. His specialty was the Middle East, and when he received word he was to leave last November for Camp LeJeune in North Carolina, he wasn't surprised. He stayed at the Camp for a month preparing for war with Iraq. When Frank was asked about the trip to Saudi Arabia, his reply was, " The

entire trip over there I thought nothing about my family, or my life here in the states. All I could focus on was what I was going there for, to do what I had learned to do the best, and to serve my country. But the truth is, it's

terrifying." Williams, 29, received a bachelor's degree in Aerospace Engineering from Georgia Tech and a masters degree in Education from Orange College. He taught Mathematics for one year at Shorecrest Preparatory School in St. Petersburg, Florida and joined the CIA for a brief time in 1987. Williams then decided to attend FSU and become a trial lawyer. "The stress and con-




