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THE FLORIDA BAR'S ENVIRONMENTAL AND LAND USE LAW SECTION'S STORMWATER AND SOLID WASTE LEGISLATIVE HISTORY PROJECTS

During the past two years, the Environmental and Land Use Law Section of the Florida Bar has sponsored a legislative history project. The Section contracted with the Policy Studies Clinic at the Florida State University College of Law to conduct the project. The purpose behind the project was two-fold: 1) to provide a comprehensive legislative history for practioners in a complex and ever-changing area of Florida law, and 2) to provide an opportunity for law students to experience the legislative process.

Each year the Section chose several environmental bills of significant importance. Teams of Policy Studies Fellows tracked the bills through the legislative session. Bill-tracking consisted of attending committee meetings, interviewing staff, and collecting all materials relied upon in the decision-making process, thereby creating a complete legislative history of the individual bills. Only bills that eventually became law were published in the legislative history compilations.

The team of law students for the 1988 legislative history project included Celia M. Mendez, Harriet R. Williams, and Michael A. Pfundstein. The team of law students for the 1989 legislative history project included Juan P. Bauta II, Joan K. Koch, and Lillian M. Tilford.

The legislative history project for 1988 tracked CS/HB 1487 and CS/SB 1192, the Florida Solid Waste Management Act. The table of contents for the 1988 legislative history project is included in Appendix A.

The legislative history project for 1989 tracked CS/HB 1304 and CS/SB 484, an act relating to stormwater management. The table of contents for the 1989 legislative history project is included in Appendix B.
