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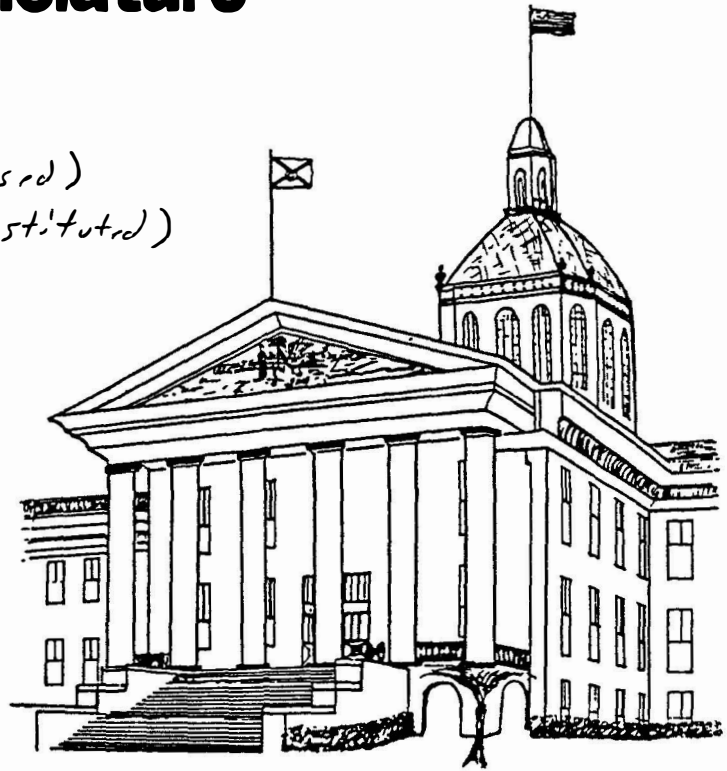

I. SUMMARY:

A. Present Situation:

Currently, section 561.221, 1978 Supplement, authorizes a licensed manufacturer of malt beverages or wine to hold two retailer's licenses to sell these beverages. This section also requires that the vendor's location be contiguous to the manufacturing plant.

B. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill would allow a manufacturer to hold three retailer's licenses under the same provision as stated above.

II. ECONOMIC IMPACT AND FISCAL NOTE:

A. Public:

A representative of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco has stated that there are three manufacturers in the state that could hold a retailer's license under the current law. Only one now holds a valid retailer's license.

It has been represented to staff that this manufacturer intends to expand its facilities to include an additional outlet for dispensing beverages. The economic impact of this expansion is not quantifiable at this time.

B. If a manufacturer chooses to hold an additional retailer's license, an annual license fee would be required. The actual number of licenses which would be applied for and issued is not known but, at this time, it is anticipated to be only one.
