Florida Senate & House of Representatives

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By Representatives Lawson and Gustafson

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to motor vehicle insurance; creating s. 627.0635, F.S., requiring insurers to provide premium reductions for operators of certain motor vehicles equipped with passive occupant restraint systems; requiring consideration of savings and other effects resulting from legislation requiring use of seat belts in rate filings by insurers; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 627.0635, Florida Statutes, is created to read.

627.0635 Passive restraint systems; discounts or credits.--

(1) For the purpose of this section, the meaning of the term "motor vehicle" as defined in s. 627.732(1) shall govern.

(2) Any rate, rating schedule or rating manual for motor vehicle insurance filed in this state shall provide for an appropriate reduction in or credit on premiums for personal injury protection and medical payment coverages with respect to any insured motor vehicle equipped with a passive occupant restraint system for front-seat passengers, which system meets the federal standards required under 49 CFR Part 571, Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard, Occupant Crash Protection, of the U.S. Department of Transportation.

(3) Insurers shall, for any rate, rating schedule or rating manual, include in their filing specific consideration

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1 and recognition of any savings, efficiencies, or other effects  
 2 associated with increased seat belt use resulting from 1.18  
 3 legislation requiring use of seat belts, and any such savings, 1.19  
 4 efficiencies or other effects shall be reflected in the rates  
 5 for the applicable coverages. 1.20

6 Section 2 This act shall take effect October 1, 1986, 1.21  
 7 and shall apply to policies issued or renewed on or after that 1.22

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SENATE SUMMARY

Requires insurers of motor vehicles to provide a reduction in insurance premiums for the operator of a motor vehicle equipped with a passive occupant restraint system that meets specified federal standards. Requires insurers to consider effects from seat belt legislation in their rate filings.
