A bill to be entitled

An act relating to school buses; requiring seat belts in certain school buses; requiring a public school district to certify annually to the Department of Education that the district school buses are equipped with seat belts; providing that a school bus driver require seat belt use; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) Each school bus that is used to provide a public school district with school bus service for the transportation of pupils in the district shall be equipped with a seat belt for the bus driver and each passenger.

- The district shall annually certify to the Department of Education that each school bus that operates in the district as specified in subsection (1) is equipped with fully operational seat belts for the bus driver and each passenger.
- (3) The driver of a school bus covered under subsection (1) shall be responsible for requiring all passengers in the bus to use their seat belts at all times while riding in the bus.

Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1987. **********

SENATE SUMMARY

Requires school buses serving public school districts to be equipped with seat belts. Requires each school district to certify to the Department of Education that the district school buses are so equipped. Places on bus drivers the responsibility for requiring passengers to use the seat belts.
