Currently, section 549.08, Florida Statutes, makes it illegal for persons to conduct a racing event on a highway, street or in a park within a municipality unless that person has been issued a permit by the municipality. That section also requires that persons issued a permit for such activity restore to its pre-existing condition any highways, streets, alleys, sidewalks, buildings or parks so that they are suitable for their normal use.

This bill clarifies that the permit is to be issued for the same time period as the contract for the racing event. It further provides that restoration that includes asphalt or paving must occur after the expiration of the permit, or, in the event a race does not take place, with 13 months of the running of the previous race.

II. ECONOMIC IMPACT:

A. Public:

This bill would have an impact on those persons who may cause damage as a result of a race. The cost to them would be determined by the amount of damage generated.

B. Government:

This should not have any governmental fiscal impact.

III. STATE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN IMPACT:

This bill is consistent with the following State Comprehensive Plan goal which states:

o (a) Goal.--Florida shall protect the substantial investments in public facilities that already exist, . . . to serve residents in a timely, orderly, and efficient manner.

IV. COMMENTS:

None.

V. AMENDMENTS:

One amendment was added by the Committee on Community Affairs on 4/28/87. The amendment provides that if a race does not occur, the restoration of any asphalt or paving must take place within 24 months of the running of the previous race.

VI. END OF SESSION UPDATE:

The bill passed the House and Senate with the Committee on Community Affairs amendment. Ordered enrolled May 29, 1987. Chapter 87-214, Laws of Florida.
