An act relating to state uniform traffic control; amending s. 316.1967, F.S.; providing that when an affidavit is submitted with respect to parking ticket violations indicating that the owner of the vehicle was not the violator, the affidavit shall be admissible under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 316.1967, Florida 14 Statutes, is amended to read:

316.1967 Liability for payment of parking ticket 16 violations. --

(1) The owner of a vehicle is responsible and liable 18 for payment of any parking ticket violation unless the owner can furnish evidence that the vehicle was, at the time of the 20 parking violation, in the care, custody, or control of another In such instances, the owner of the vehicle is 22 required, within a reasonable time after notification of the parking violation, to furnish to the appropriate law 24 enforcement authorities an affidavit setting forth the name, 25 and address, and driver's license number of the person or company who leased, rented, or otherwise had the care, custody, or control of the vehicle. The affidavit submitted pursuant to this subsection shall be admissible in a proceeding charging a parking ticket violation and shall raise the rebuttable presumption that the person identified in the affidavit is responsible for payment of the parking ticket

The owner of a vehicle is not responsible for a parking ticket violation if the vehicle involved was, at the time, stolen or in the care, custody, or control of some person who did not have permission of the owner to use the vehicle. Section 2. The affidavit shall be admissible in a proceeding charging a parking ticket violation, and shall raise the rebuttable presumption that the person identified in the affidavit is responsible for payment of the parking ticket violation.

Currently, section 316.1967, F.S., states that the owner of a vehicle is responsible and liable for payment of any parking ticket violation unless the owner can furnish evidence that the vehicle was, at the time of the parking violation, in the care, custody, or control of another person. In such instances, the owner of the vehicle is required, within a reasonable time after notification of the parking violation, to furnish to the appropriate law enforcement authorities the name and address of the person or company who leased, rented, or otherwise had the care, custody, or control of the vehicle.

The owner of a vehicle is not responsible for a parking ticket violation if the vehicle involved was, at the time, stolen or in the care, custody, or control of some person who did not have permission of the owner to use the vehicle.
