Chapter 15, Florida Statutes, provides for the designation of various state symbols. Examples of designated symbols are:

1. The sabal palmetto palm, listed as the official state tree,
2. The horse conch, listed as the state shell,
3. The agatized coral, listed as the state stone,
4. The moonstone, listed as the state gem,
5. The Florida panther, listed as the state animal, and,
6. The American alligator, listed as the state reptile.

Presently, there is no designation provided for a state soil.

This bill designates myakka fine sand (sandy, siliceous, hyperthermic Aeric Haplaquods) as the official state soil of Florida.


