H 1330 GENERAL BILL/CS/1ST ENG by Natural Resources; Tobiasen and others (Compare H 429, CS/H 795, CS/H 905, CS/S 594, CS/S 602, S 1057, S 1147)
Saltwater Fisheries/Licenses; requires license for nonresident to take finfish by net; provides that net registration be issued to each net used for noncommercial purposes & that, when issued, it may only be issued to residents; expands definition of term "commercial vessel"; increases license fees for saltwater products license; extends by one day period of time for purchase of clam license in Brevard & Indian River Counties, etc. Amends 370.06, 327.02, 327.28. Effective Date: 10/01/89 except as otherwise provided.

I. SUMMARY:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

At the present time, all nets used to take finfish must be licensed and registered with the Department of Natural Resources. Nets used to take finfish for commercial purposes are registered under a saltwater products license and must bear the number of the license. Noncommercial nets must be registered and must bear the name of the person in whose name the net is registered.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill would require the net of a nonresident, including one used for noncommercial purposes, to be licensed under a saltwater products license. In addition, this bill limits noncommercial net registration to only residents of the state.

II. FISCAL ANALYSIS & ECONOMIC IMPACT STATEMENT:

A. FISCAL IMPACT ON STATE AGENCIES/STATE FUNDS:

1. Non-recurring or First Year Start-Up Effects:

None.

2. Recurring or Annualized Continuation Effects:

None.

3. Long Run Effects Other Than Normal Growth:

None.

4. Appropriations Consequences:

This bill may result in a positive fiscal impact for the state. Nonresidents using nets for noncommercial purposes would have to purchase a saltwater products license.

C. DIRECT ECONOMIC IMPACT ON PRIVATE SECTOR:

1. Direct Private Sector Costs:

Nonresidents, using nets to harvest finfish for noncommercial purposes, would have to register their nets under saltwater products licenses. If they do not have such a license, they would have to purchase one. Nonresident saltwater products license fees are \$100 for an individual license and \$200 for a vessel license.

2. Direct Private Sector Benefits:

None.

3. Effects on Competition, Private Enterprise, and Employment Markets:

None.

D. FISCAL COMMENTS:

None.

III. LONG RANGE CONSEQUENCES:

This bill is consistent with the State Comprehensive Plan.

IV. COMMENTS:

This bill is not inconsistent with the committee's mission statement. However, there is not a specific provision that addresses this issue.





Saltwater fisheries

BILL NO. AND SPONSOR:

SB 1147 by
Senator KirkpatrickI. SUMMARY:

A. Present Situation:

Section 370.06(3), F.S., requires that all nets used to take finfish, except for cast nets and bait seines which are 100 feet or less in length and which have a mesh that is 3/8 inch or less, be licensed or registered. A net used to take finfish commercially must have a saltwater products license. A net used to take finfish for noncommercial purposes must be issued a noncommercial net registration. For purposes of net licensing and registration, no distinction is made between residents of the state and nonresidents.

The saltwater products license fee is \$25 for a Florida resident, \$100 for a nonresident, and \$150 for an alien.

B. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill requires all nets subject to regulation which are used by a nonresident to take finfish to be licensed under a saltwater products license. A noncommercial net registration may only be issued to Florida residents.

II. ECONOMIC IMPACT AND FISCAL NOTE:

A. Public:

All nonresidents who use nets subject to regulation for the harvest of finfish would have to pay \$100 for a saltwater products license (\$150 if an alien).

B. Government:

There are currently 241 nonresident and 10 alien noncommercial net registrations. If all purchased saltwater products licenses, revenues would be \$25,600 annually.
