I. SUMMARY:

A. Present Situation:

Chapter 457, Florida Statutes, provides for the regulation of the practice of acupuncture by the Board of Acupuncture within the Department of Professional Regulation. The law sets forth the requirements for licensure, including completion of certain educational or experience requirements and passage of an examination administered by the department. Currently, the statute does not provide for licensure of individuals licensed to practice acupuncture in other states.

B. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill adds alternatives to passage of the department's licensure examination as avenues to qualify for licensure as an acupuncturist in Florida. These alternative criteria for licensure are successful completion of a board-approved national certification process, or active licensure in another state with examination requirements which are substantially equivalent to the Florida examination requirements. Applicants must still meet the current educational or experience requirements for licensure set forth in the statute.

II. ECONOMIC IMPACT AND FISCAL NOTE:

A. Public:

Applicants who meet one of the alternative criteria to passing the Florida licensure examination will benefit by not incurring the costs associated with taking the examination.

B. Government:

If the bill results in an increase in the number of acupuncture licensees, as anticipated by the department, it will benefit the department through increased revenues. These increased revenues should help offset the Board of Acupuncture's current deficit in its Professional Regulation Trust Fund account. In fiscal year 1988-89, the deficit is projected to be \$337,589.

III. <u>COMMENTS:</u>

According to the department, applicants for licensure for 29 of the 43 professions under its jurisdiction are afforded the opportunity to qualify for licensure by endorsement. Generally, criteria for licensure by endorsement include either licensure in another state with substantially equivalent licensing requirements, or passage of a national examination equivalent to the examination required in Florida.
