A. Present Situation:

The University of Florida's oldest library is currently referred to as "Library East."

B. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The proposed bill would name the oldest library at the University of Florida the George A. Smathers Library. It would also direct the University of Florida to erect suitable markers identifying the building.

George Smathers is a distinguished alumnus of the University of Florida. Since graduating, he has served with distinction as Assistant United States Attorney for the Southern District of Florida, in the United States House of Representatives from 1947 through 1950 and the United States Senate from 1950 through 1968.

George Smathers has financially supported the University of Florida, with annual gifts to the Debate Team and other educational programs, and this year has given \$1.9 million, which will be matched by the state and will create a \$3.8 million fund to renovate the university's oldest library building and make it the university's official repository for special collections. one.

I. SUMMARY:

A. PRESENT SITUATION:

Section 267.062, F.S., provides that except as specifically provided by law, no state building, road, bridge, park, recreational complex or other similar facility shall be named for any living person.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

House Bill 1559 designates Library East on the University of Florida campus be named the George A. Smathers Library.

Senator Smathers attended the University of Florida earning a B.A. degree in 1936 and a Law degree in 1938 and subsequently distinguished himself in service to the University of Florida, the State of Florida and the United States of America.

He served in the United States Congress from 1947 through 1950 and was elected United States Senator from Florida serving with distinction from 1950 through 1968 providing leadership and assistance not only for his country but also his state, the University of Florida and higher education for 22 years.

Senator Smathers has continued to financially support the University of Florida and this year has provided a gift totaling \$1.9 million, which, when matched dollar for dollar by the State of Florida under legislation passed in 1988, will create a \$3.8 million fund to renovate the university's oldest library building and make it the university's official repository for special collections.

The University of Florida is authorized to expend funds within existing resources to erect the appropriate identification markers for such library.


